A Snowman Book Report

Genre: Student Choice - Students may choose a book from any genre of literature.

Learning Objectives:

A Snowman Book Report Instructions

- 1. This month's genre is **student choice**. Students may choose a book from any genre from the approved classic reading list (or a medal award winner). If there is a book that your child would like to read that is not on this list, email me for approval.
- 2. Design a Snowman (see attachment) that represents the book that was read. <u>Please follow the attached instructions carefully</u>. Points will be deducted for book reports that do not follow these instructions (see Rubric).
- 3. Fill in all of the information. Be sure to write neatly.
 - a. Write important events from the beginning, middle, and end of the book.
 - b. Write your name on the "By:" line.
 - c. Write the title and author on the corresponding lines at the bottom.
- 4. Be creative! Add a hat, scarf, buttons, nose, etc. Use crayons/markers to make it colorful. (Additional decorations may be used.)
- 5. Cut out the Snowman and glue it to another piece of colorful paper for presentation and/or display.
- 6. Due to Winter Break, this book report is due on: <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>December</u> <u>19th</u>. Points will be deducted for book reports turned in after the due date.
