A Poet-Tree Book Report


Genre: Poetry - Poetry is a form of literature in which special consideration is given to the expression of feelings and ideas by the use of a distinctive style and rhythm, usually through the use of rhyming words.


Learning Objectives:

A Poet-Tree Book Report Instructions

- 1. This month's genre is **poetry**. Students must choose a book of this genre from the approved classic reading list (or a medal award winner). Students must read a collection of poetry, not just a single poem. If there is a book that your child would like to read that is not on this list, email me for approval.
- 2. Create a Poet-Tree Book Report (see attachment) that represents the collection of poetry that was read. <u>Please follow the attached instructions carefully</u>. Points will be deducted for book reports that do not follow these instructions (see Rubric).
- 3. Fill in all of the information. Be sure to write neatly.
 - a. Write the following information in the corresponding leaves: title of the poetry collection, your name, poet's name, your favorite poem, rhyming words (2 leaves). Please color the leaves lightly so that writing can be read.
- 4. Be creative! Use crayons/markers to make it colorful. (Additional decorations may be used.)
- 5. Cut out the leaves and glue them to the Poet-Tree. Cut out the Poet-Tree and glue it to another piece of colorful paper for presentation and/or display.
- 6. This book report is due on: **Friday, May 18th**. No book reports will be accepted after the due date.
