A Fact Tree Book Report


Genre: Non-Fiction - Non-fiction is a genre of literature comprising works that present information (facts). Non-fiction works are based on REAL events, REAL people, and/or REAL animals.

Learning Objectives:

- 1.RL.5: I can tell the difference between fiction and nonfiction.
- 1.RI.2: I can pick out the topic and supporting details (facts) in a text.
- 1.RI.10: I can read informational texts.
- 1.RF.4: I can read with fluency, accuracy, purpose, and understanding.

A Fact Tree Book Report Instructions

- 1. This month's genre is **non-fiction**. Students must choose a book of this genre from the approved classic reading list (or a medal award winner). If there is a book that your child would like to read that is not on this list, email me for approval.
- 2. Design a Fact Tree Book Report (see attachment) that represents the book that was read. <u>Please follow the attached instructions carefully</u>. Points will be deducted for book reports that do not follow these instructions (see Rubric).
- 3. Fill in all of the information. Be sure to write neatly.
 - a. Write the title of the book in the star.
 - b. Write your name in the center ornament that is labeled "Name:"
 - c. Write four facts from the book in the corresponding ornaments.
- 4. Be creative! Use crayons/markers to make it colorful. (Additional decorations may be used.)
- 5. Cut out the Fact Tree and glue it to another piece of colorful paper for presentation and/or display.
- 6. This book report is due on: **Thursday**, **November 30**th. Points will be deducted for book reports turned in after the due date.
